Braiswick Primary 2021/22

Vision:

All pupils leaving Braiswick primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

Objective:

We intend to use the Sports Premium to achieve:

- The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school and wider community through the attendance at a range of sporting competitions
- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- Increased participation in competitive sport through joining Colchester and Blackwater Sports Partnership
- Active lunchtimes where children can participate in a range of games and sports

The budget for 21/22 is estimated at £19570 (based on £16,000 + 357 pupils x£10 each) plus £1000 carry over
